Death of Famous Skydiver

R.I.P. Felix Baumgartner April 20, 1969 - July 17, 2025

Felix Baumgartner, the Austrian skydiver celebrated for his 2012 record-breaking jump from the stratosphere, died on July 17, 2025, in a tragic paragliding accident in Porto Sant'Elpidio on Italy's Adriatic coast. He was 56 years old.

He lost control of his motorized paraglider and according to eyewitnesses crashed near a swimming pool in the tourist village. Reports indicate that he may have suffered a health episode during the flight, which caused him to lose control.

Besides many exploits including thousands of jumps he is noted for a 2012 world record of a jump from a balloon at 128,000* feet attaining supersonic speed.

*(Baumgartner's record was broken in 2014 by Alan Eustace at 135,890 feet).

In 2012 Austrian Felix Baumgartner successfully broke Joe Kittinger's record for the world's highest parachute jump that was set in 1960 (see video #3 in the Parachute Museum Theater series). Baumgartner dropped from an unofficial altitude of 128,000 feet - about 1.5 miles higher than expected. In the process, he also became the first skydiver to exceed the speed of sound - 833.9 mph while in freefall (Mach 1.24 - the first supersonic skydive). He and the Stratos Red Bull team broke three more records: Highest manned balloon flight, 128,000 feet; greatest freefall distance, 119,846 feet; fastest mechanically unaided speed, 833.9 mph. Joe Kittinger, whose record was broken, is the one in mission control communicating with Baumgartner in this dramatic video. Red Bull Stratos Project space dive 2012 presented by BBC Studios.



Celebrate the 150th Birthday of Alice Dunbar Nelson

New Exhibit on Alice Dunbar at the Paul Laurence Dunbar House Dayton Aviation Heritage National Historical Park through September 28, 2025



Alice Dunbar Nelson was an influential African American poet, author, and activist whose work addressed themes of race, gender, and social justice. Born in New Orleans, Louisiana, she emerged as a prominent voice of the Harlem Renaissance, publishing poetry, short stories, and essays that highlighted the struggles and resilience of Black women. Dunbar Nelson was also deeply involved in social activism, advocating for civil rights and women's suffrage throughout her life. She was married to the famous poet Paul Laurence Dunbar, and after his death, she continued to promote his work while forging her own literary path. Her legacy is celebrated for its contributions to American literature and its enduring impact on social movements.

This summer marks the 150th anniversary of Alice's birth, and so the Paul Laurence Dunbar House Historic Site is proud to present two major events celebrating her life and achievements: • Beyond Paul: Alice Dunbar Nelson's Life and Legacyan exhibit of Alice's writings and her collected works in partnership with the University of Delaware from July 19 to September 28, 2025. • "An Afternoon with Alice" - Alice's legacy was honored on July 19 with a presentation by Ms. Karsyn Williams, featuring poetry and fascinating insights about Alice's life...



Katherine Wright, born Aug. 19, 1874

National Aviation Day is a United States national observation that celebrates the development of aviation. The holiday was established in 1939 by President Franklin Roosevelt by presidential proclamation. August 19 is the birthday of both Orville Wright (1871) and his sister Katherine Wright (1874).

This is a good time to celebrate the day by reading more about the Wrights. Besides Wilbur and Orville, Katherine's support of their efforts also contributed greatly to aviation, along with many other accomplishments of her own.
