Held each September, Concours d'Elegance is Dayton's premier antique and classic automobile and motorcycle show. Guests travel from across the map to witness this breathtaking display of "art on wheels"—some of the finest vehicles in the country.



Dayton Concours at Carillon Historical Park features around 200 antique and classic automobiles and motorcycles, and vehicles are judged for around 30 awards. While the theme changes year-to-year, nationally-recognized automotive artists, hand-built model cars, an automobile raffle, and other autothemed attractions are standard for this acclaimed event.

Concours d'Elegance occurs on Sunday, but the weekend kicks off the night before with the Concours d'Elegance Preview Party—a casual, public event on the grounds of Carillon Historical Park. The National Aviation Hall of Fame **Armstrong Award**

NAHF to Present Prestigious Armstrong Award to Aviation Entrepreneur, Co-founder, and CEO of ForeFlight Tyson Weihs

Dayton, OH August 10, 2023: The Board of Trustees of the National Aviation Hall of Fame (NAHF) is pleased to announce that the 2023 Armstrong Award will recognize Co-founder (and CEO for fifteen years) of ForeFlight, Tyson Weihs.

"This award publicly acknowledges Tyson's dedication to leadership in promoting aviation and the values of innovation, integrity, and service," explained NAHF President & CEO Aimee Maruyama. "Tyson's story is an inspiration for future generations of aviation innovators and entrepreneurs."

Weihs is being honored specifically for his innovative spirit, commitment to safety, and service to the aviation community as Co-Founder of ForeFlight, the leading provider of critically-acclaimed, essential Integrated Flight Application software for aviation. ForeFlight is an invaluable companion for pilots that packs rich airport information, search, and aviation weather imagery in a single package. "Receiving the Armstrong Award is deeply humbling," said Tyson Weihs, reflecting on the recognition. "I am truly honored to be part of the distinguished legacy of aviation, and I believe this award underscores the limitless possibilities that aviation holds for those who dare to dream and push boundaries."

"Not only has Tyson left an indelible mark on aviation by co-founding ForeFlight," said NAHF Chair Jim Cooling, "he is also a valuable member of the aviation community, giving generously with his leadership, time, and expertise to support numerous aviation organizations."

Weihs will receive the award on September 21, 2023, at the President's Reception as part of the National Aviation Hall of Fame's 59th Enshrinement events. Over 600 people are expected to attend two days of events in Washington D.C., including government and industry leaders and several returning Enshrinees, including former NASA astronauts Charlie Bolden, Eileen Collins, Bob Crippen, and Hoot Gibson, aviation visionary Joan Sullivan Garrett, general aviation titans Dale Klapmeier and Russ Meyer, and world champion aerobatic aviator Sean D. Tucker.

The ceremony, led by emcee CNN's Pete Muntean, features the formal installment of the NAHF Enshrinee Class of 2023; pioneers (the late) Velta Benn and (the late) Cornelius Coffey, visionaries Angela Gittens and (the late) Ed Stimpson, and aerospace heroes Fred Haise and Kathryn Sullivan.

WACO Pilot Bob Wagner Honored

The 2023 Ivonette Wright Miller Award presented by the National Aviation Heritage Area

The **Ivonette Wright Miller Award** recognizes a lifetime volunteer in the service of aviation heritage. It is named for the niece of Wilbur and Orville Wright. Bob Wagner was nominated for the award by WACO Air Museum. The presentation was made on Tuesday, August 8 at the <u>National Aviation Heritage Area</u> Annual meeting at the Wright State University Special Collections & Archives in Dunbar Library.

Bob Wagner bio:

Bob is a rated commercial pilot in SEL, SES, MEL, glider and instrument airplane. He has been a certified flight instructor since 1959 in airplane single and multiengine and instrument airplane. He got his aircraft and powerplant mechanic license in 1973 and his FAA inspection authorization in 1976. He served as an FAA designated flight examiner for single engine land and sea and multiengine land aircraft. He has also served as chief pilot for FAA 135 air taxi operation, chief instructor for a FAA 141 flight school and director of maintenance for FAA 135 air taxi operation.



He met his wife - <u>Pat Wagner</u> - at the airport in the mid 60's when Pat began flying lessons, married her in 1968 and began their <u>wing riding routine</u> in 1971 -



although that was not in the marriage contract. They have continued to fly this act for over thirty years. They have had their Stearman in all contiguous 48 states except Rhode Island, all Canadian provinces from Quebec westward to British Columbia, and even through the Caribbean islands to Venezuela. Their Stearman now is on display at the WAAAM Museum in Hood River, Oregon.

Fast forward to 2001 and Bob was flying air shows in a new WACO YMF-5 for WACO Classic Corporation in Battlecreek, Michigan and demonstrating the 1928 Linco WACO Taperwing for Goodrich Corporation at airshows around the country in addition to the wing act, and his comedy antics as "Zeke Devers" a hog farmer, who is attempting his first solo flight in a Citabria.

Bob has served as a consultant with WACO Aircraft providing pilot services, instruction and maintenance on the new production WACO. He has also met and helped assemble their aircraft around the world in Hawaii, England, Germany, Switzerland and Kenya, Africa and checked out their pilots.

Bob and Pat's love of aviation continues to their "home" life. In 1982 they purchased their own airport in Troy, Ohio- now known as "Wagner International Airport" a grass strip 1900+ feet long from the center of the road to the far fence line with a house and 2 large hangars. Pat's clipped wing Cub, a Citabria and a joint-owned Aeronca Champ are based there.

Bob and Pat are members of numerous aviation and museum organizations and enjoy volunteering in their spare time. You can often find Bob flying "Sunny" around the blue skies of Troy, Ohio.
