Ringing in the Holidays


A Carillon Preview Christmas Party November 22, 2025

ABOUT THE HOLIDAY LIGHTS:

For over ten years now, the Armstrong Air & Space Museum has been inaugurating the holiday season by illuminating their grounds with a vast array of festive and colorful lights known as the Holiday Lights Display. The



overall exhibition contains a multitude of aviation and space-themed displays made from tens of thousands of vibrant LED bulbs, with prominent works including a twenty-foot-tall Saturn V rocket and a giant Apollo-era astronaut saluting the American flag.

TIPS FOR VISITING:

The average guest takes about 15-45 minutes to view the light displays.

The entire experience is outside, so plan for winter weather in Ohio!

The museum closes at 5:00 pm and is usually not open when the lights are on. There are no outdoor restrooms so plan your visit accordingly.

There are no food or beverages sold but a number of restaurants are close by.

Guests are asked to refrain from touching the lights and cords.



Highlighting a Parachute Museum Exhibit

Video of Famous jump from the edge of space August 16, 1960



Colonel Joseph W. Kittinger, Jr. (1928-2022)

One of the Parachute Museum's most popular exhibits is an interactive display of Joe Kittinger's 102,800-foot jump from a balloon gondola that set a world record in 1960. Col. Kittinger, a decorated Air Force veteran and aerospace pioneer, was testing a parachute system designed to assist pilots to eject at high altitudes. But his mission also proved that humans could survive and function in near-space conditions and helped advance preparation for human spaceflight. At that time this set the record for the highest balloon ascent, highest parachute jump (102,800 feet), longest drogue fall and fastest speed by a human through the atmosphere (614 mph).

Col. Kittinger was a 1997 enshrinee in the National Aviation Hall of Fame. Another video of his historic jump can be seen on the Parachute Museum Theater page, video number 3, at: https://www.aviationtrailinc.org/parachute-museum-theater (The Felix Baumgartner* jump that eventually broke his record is also featured on that page in video number 6. Joe Kittinger was in mission control for that 2012 jump and can be seen communicating with Baumgartner in this dramatic video).

*The referenced jump by Felix Baumgartner was accomplished in 2012, with a jump from 128,100 feet, breaking Kittinger's record, and becoming the first skydiver to exceed the speed of sound while in freefall (833.9 mph). The altitude record was again broken in 2014 by Alan Eustace with a jump from 25 mile above the earth.

DAYTON, OHIO - October 13, 2025 - The National Aviation Hall of Fame (NAHF) is proud to announce the outstanding individuals selected for induction into the Hall with the Class of 2026. These trailblazers have made groundbreaking contributions to aviation and aerospace, from breaking barriers and advancing safety standards to pioneering innovative technologies and inspiring future generations. Their induction ceremony will take place on September 24, 2026, in Washington, D.C., underscoring the NAHF's enduring mission to honor America's aerospace legends and inspire future leaders.

Since its founding in 1962, Enshrinement into the NAHF has widely been recognized as the pinnacle of individual achievement in aviation and space exploration, celebrating pioneers who have shaped the industry while inspiring future generations to follow in their groundbreaking footsteps. With 270 notable individuals enshrined to date, it remains the only Congressionally chartered aviation hall of fame in the United States. The inductees are chosen by a distinguished panel of aviation professionals from across the country who serve on the NAHF Board of Nominations, undertaking the challenging task of selecting the most deserving pioneers in air and space each year.
