The Dayton Aviation Trail is a self-guided tour of selected, aviation-related sites open to the public. The 17 sites are located in eight geographic areas around Dayton and nearby towns: five areas in Dayton, four areas in east suburbs, two in south suburbs and additional sites in Troy, Urbana, Wapakoneta, Batavia, and Middletown (see map). The majority of the sites have some sort of relationship to Wilbur and Orville Wright, inventors of the airplane. Later aspects of the area's aviation heritage also are represented.
