## The WACO Cootie The First WACO Aircraft

March 16, - WACO Historical Society Aviation Lecture Series WACO Air Museum, 1865 South County Road 25A, Troy, Ohio 45373 Thursday, March 16, 2023. Doors open at 6:30 p.m., lecture starts at 7 p.m.



#### The WACO Cootie

As WACO leads up to the 100th Anniversary Celebration of coming to Troy, OH, the Aviation Lecture Series will focus on topics specific to the history of WACO. On Thursday, March 16th, at 7 pm, Brian Meyer will discuss the first flyable WACO Aircraft, known as "The Cootie." Brian both designed, constructed, and flew the full-size replica that now hangs in the WACO Air Museum. His presentation will cover a brief history of the Cootie, the design and construction process, the first flight in the replica, and subsequent flight testing of the airplane that he donated to the museum.

Brian has over forty years of aeronautical engineering and management experience with major airplane, helicopter, turbine-engine, and propeller manufacturers. He holds a B.S in Aerospace Engineering from the University of Michigan, and a Master's degree for Embry-Riddle Aeronautical University. His engineering specialties include aerodynamics, performance, ground test, flight test, design, icing, vibration, program management and FAA certification. He is a former FAA Designated Engineering Representative (DER) and a registered Professional Engineer (PE) in the state of Ohio. Brian has received two patents and authored a number of technical papers and magazine articles on various aviation subjects.

He is also an airplane and glider pilot with over 4,400 landings, previously held a low-altitude FAA aerobatic competency (airshow) card, and holds FAA Airframe and Powerplant Mechanic certificates. Brian has over 18,000 hours of aircraft construction experience and has built and test-flown six airplanes including three airplanes that he designed. These include the WACO Cootie replica.

All aviation lectures are free and open to the public and are scheduled to last one hour, beginning at 7 pm, with questions to follow. The lecture is held in the Willis Wing of the WACO Air Museum at 1865 South County Road 25A in Troy, OH. Doors will open at 6:30. Donations to the WACO Air Museum are gratefully accepted. #### Keynote Speaker: Col. Mark Tillman

Our Nation's 12th Presidential Pilot, Col. Mark Tillman (ret.) served as Pilot and Commander of Air Force One from 2001-2009. Col. Tillman was at the controls of Air Force One through numerous national events, most notably during the terrorist attacks of September 11th, 2001.

Col. Tillman's distinguished career spans 30 years in the United States Air Force. His flying experience includes time as a T-37 Instructor Pilot, C-130 Transport Pilot, VIP Airlift, and Presidential Pilot and Commander of Air Force One (a modified Boeing 747).

Col. Mark W. Tillman (ret.) served as the Pilot of Air Force One from 2001-2009 and he flew President Bush on the

day of the 9/11 terrorist attacks. During 9/11, Air Force One made flights into the U.S. heartland to evade a possible attack on the President. Additionally, Col. Tillman planned and flew the President into Bagdad, Iraq which was the first time in history that a sitting U.S. President had entered an active war zone. The Champaign Aviation Museum is honored to have such a distinguished speaker to our 2023 Gala.

### The National Aviation Hall of Fame Announces the "Class of 2023"

Two iconic history-making pilots, two groundbreakers in aviation policy, and two NASA astronauts, are all included in this remarkable group.

DAYTON, OHIO - February 21, 2023 - The National Aviation Hall of Fame (NAHF) is excited to announce plans for its 2023 Enshrinement ceremonies. The following individuals who have been selected for the Class of 2023 will be enshrined at the annual ceremony to be held at the National Building Museum in Washington, D.C., on September 22, 2023.

Each year, the NAHF Board of Nominations, a voting body comprised of over 130 aviation professionals nationwide, selects from a prestigious group of nominated air and space pioneers to be recognized for their achievements with induction into the NAHF. Since its founding in 1962, 254 people have been honored with induction into the only Congressionally-chartered aviation hall of fame in the United States.

"We believe this is an excellent class, and we are already looking forward to their induction in Washington, DC," NAHF Board of Nominations Chair Tom Lodge said. "From pioneers Benn and Coffey to visionaries Gittens and Stimpson and to aerospace heroes Haise and Sullivan, the NAHF's Class of 2023 represents the best in aviation. We applaud the Board of Nominations for their challenging and thorough work."

The NAHF Class of 2023 is a diverse group representing a broad range of enduring contributions to both the advancement of flight and human exploration of space:



Kathryn Sullivan- Geologist, oceanographer, NASA astronaut, US Navy officer, and National Oceanic and Atmospheric Administration administrator. The first American woman to walk in space, veteran of three shuttle missions. First woman to visit the deepest spot in the oceans, the Challenger Deep.



Angela Gittens- Ground breaking leader who shaped airport security and policy as the CEO of multiple large-hub airports, including ATL, and Director General of ACI-World.



Fred Haise- US Marine, fighter pilot, test pilot, Apollo astronaut, Space Shuttle astronaut, aerospace executive, and advocate. Vast influence and experience in US aerospace history. Best selling author.



(The Late) Ed Stimpson- Business aviation legend. Over 40 years, served in multiple leadership roles and drove policy in key areas such as fuel, education, and essential in the General Aviation.



(The late) Velta Benn- Aviation pioneer who began as a WASP and went on to fly for over 63 years, amassing 55,000 flying hours as a CFI, FAA Examiner, and safety expert.



(The late) Cornelius Coffey Aviation pioneer who, despite many racial barriers, became a pilot and mechanic who opened a flight school that trained over 1.500 students, including hundreds of Tuskegee Airmen.
