Boarding passes expire on September 1, 2020, so get your's now and join the National Aviation Heritage Area's "Stay Local. Go Far." campaign. Remember to check the attractions BEFORE embarking since open times are flexible. Due to the uncertainty of COVID-19, sites are not guaranteed to be open by Sept. 1, 2020. Only one pass is required per group. Each pass may only be used at a site once. Entries are limited to one pass per email address. www.visitNAHA.com
