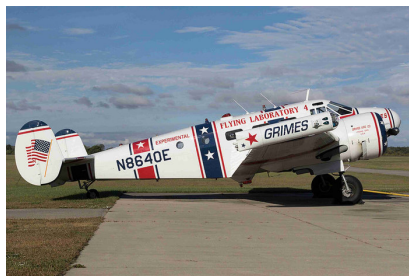

About Grimes Flying Lab Museum:

Located at Grimes Field in Urbana, the "lab" is a Beech 18 that served the U.S. Air Forces as a C-45 and was modified to a C-45H as a test bed for aircraft nighttime lighting systems. The aircraft was a valuable tool for engineers who worked for Warren G. Grimes - the father of aircraft lighting - before and during World War II to advance developments for safer flight at night. Grimes produced his first airplane lights in his garage in 1933 and by World War II his company had grown to produce lighting for military aviation. Besides memorabilia from Grimes' life and Grimes Manufacturing Co., historical and modern aircraft lighting products are displayed.

Parachute Museum News

F-4 Pilot's Ejection Seat Story



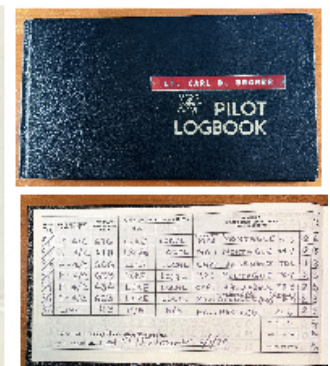
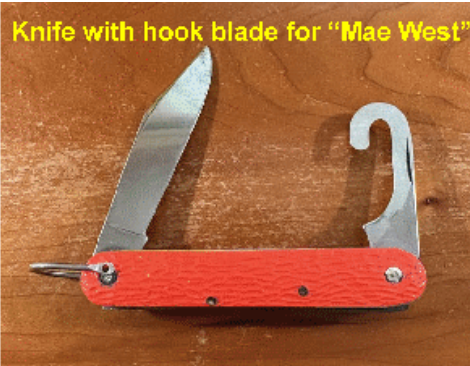
After a recent visitor to the Parachute Museum got home, he wrote back concerning the ejection seat in the museum display that is from an [F-4 Phantom](#). All U.S. ejection seats are marked with the unique tail number for the aircraft fitted with that seat. **Carl Bromer**, a native Daytonian, had met with museum curator Randy Zuercher during his visit, and then sent this photo of an F-4 that he flew, marked with tail number 676 (see photo). Carl writes that “ It turns out that I did fly that F4 on May 31, 1971, and several more times after that... It's exciting to see something like that from my past. Before enlisting in the Air Force, I was hired by NCR... that was how I came to live in Dayton. I've included a couple of photos that show we actually carried our parachutes to the aircraft in the early 70's ... I think later T-38s had the chute built into the seat . The knife is the one I carried on every mission... the hook blade was for a "May West." The Mach 2 club pin was given to each F-4 pilot who flew a mission of over Mach 2”.

The 19th annual Dayton Concours d'Elegance, a fundraiser benefiting Carillon Historical Park, returns Sunday, Sept. 20, 2026, from 10:30 a.m. to 4 p.m.

This year's event celebrates the 100th anniversary of Pontiac. Founded by General Motors in 1926, the iconic American automaker was part of a company that once had a larger presence in Dayton than anywhere outside of Detroit.

Featuring more than 150 cars and motorcycles, live music, food, historical demonstrations and family-friendly activities, the event will also commemorate the 50th anniversary of the BMW 3 Series.

The weekend begins with the Dayton Concours d'Elegance Preview Party from 6 to 9 p.m. on Saturday, Sept. 19. Guests will enjoy an exclusive first look at many of the Concours vehicles, along with live music, food and beverages, a silent auction, an automotive art pavilion and more.

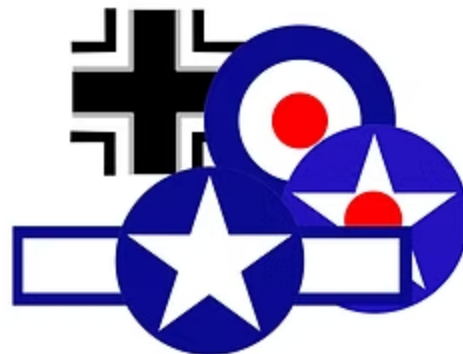
Aviation Trail visits Butler County Warbirds "Hops in the Hangar" Event

Check with each site before travelling:

Changes may occur on a day-to-day basis due to circumstances.
